We drive people to the hairdresser, dentist, optician, library, shops, a day centre, a friend in hospital, a recreational activity such as bowls, a social activity such as the board games afternoon at Woodcote Library, collect a prescription – the list goes on....

But it doesn't stop there! Our drivers are not just a taxi service; they will help you in to your appointment, make sure you are in the right place, offer an arm, carry your belongings, push a wheelchair, pass on useful information and most importantly have a chat with you as well.

We take anyone who does not have access to their own transport and cannot manage public transport. We have Blue Badges in case of disabilities.

Volunteer drivers benefit as well. As a driver, you will have the satisfaction of knowing you are offering a true lifeline to someone in need. It's an activity you can tailor exactly to your own living pattern. You make yourself available as often as you feel you can - once a month, once a week or whatever. And the lifts are usually local. Quite simply, someone in the office will ring you from time to time and, giving a few days' notice, ask if you can make a specific trip. You are free to say yes or no - there's absolutely no pressure to accept.
